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Conservation of Faunal Diversity of Western Ghats: Problems and Perspectives

Western Ghats is a home for rich floral and faunal diversity, thus considered as one of the thirty-four hot spots of global biodiversity. It is also the source of a great number of rivers, cultures and civilizations. Unfortunately uncaring for this pristine wealth, the human beings in their greed are abusing the resources and are endangering the environment, threatening the bio-diversity and pushing the universe towards slow but certain destruction. However, a redeeming factor has been the increasing awareness among the educated public.
