# COUNTDOWN 2010 -- Save Biodiversity Programmes in Chennai and Madurai, Tamil Nadu

### For Eco – Task Force, Capron Hall Girl's Higher Secondary School, Madurai

Besides their regular class time, students of Capron Hall Girls Higher Secondary School have entered into activities of COUNTDOWN 2010 – Save Biodiversity by observing and identifying natural



objects and developing an understanding of interdependence of all organisms and the need for conserving them. With the knowledge gained from the ZOO programme, 'Frogs Rock' they also taught friends, parents, teachers and neighbours. They made a request to help in save amphibians in hostels, temple and churches. They created awareness to the National Green Corp. in charge teachers. Following up this year long programme, 10 students were made members of Eco-Task Force or level II of COUNTDOWN 2010 Local on 13 July 09, because they won the II prize in District level competition for the model 'Frog in its Habitat'. In order to go into the matter depth the Amphibian Ark Art colouring books were distributed with explanation. Learning about 2 frogs per month, painting, sharing and displaying the same in the campus is the strategy.

Activities material was translated into Tamil and distributed to all. 'Bat bookmark' and South Asian Bats colouring books were distributed. Students participated in a drawing and cultural programme.
