

1985 First Intern. Studbook published shortly after it was realised, that 246 of 333 animals of the studbook were hybrids

1993 Second Intern. Studbook published

Europe - recent history

**1994**: 13.13 (26) animals in 4 institutions 1999: 27.30 (57) animals in 21 institutions **2000:** 25.28.1 (54) animals in 22 institutions **2005:** 37.43 (80) animals in 33 institutions


The European population is the only managed captive population of Asian lion outside of India

## **Problems**

- High neonate death rate: 2000-2005: 43.52.32 (127) cubs born, of which 84 DNS (66.1%)

- Founder (n=12) representation 87% (potential: 92%)

- mean inbreeding coefficient high: Urgent need of new founders
