WZACS Rocks on! September News of the new WZACS in the World

Note: We wrote to the Directors of all regional zoo associations and WAZA to see what is going on in different parts of the world with WZACS themes. Here's what we got back.

Koen Brouwer, Director of the European Association of Zoos and Aquaria wrote :

"at the upcoming EAZA Annual Conference in Bristol (September 2005) we will work on producing the second (final?) draft of an EAZA Action Plan based on the Recommendations of WZACS. The first draft was produced in workshop organized during our Council meeting in Jerez, April 2005. Furthermore EAZA will soon be distributing several hunderd copies of the WZACS to relevant European relations, e.g. conservation and animal welfare NGOs, governmental representatives, European Union representatives and relevant European media."

Onnie Byers, Executive Director of the IUCN SSC Conservation Breeding Specialist Group writes: We plan to run a working group which will discuss global, coordinated zoo-based conservation project identification/ selection and possibly a group to discuss how high currency country zoos can engage high biodiversity country zoos in WZACS inspired *in situ* projects in their locality. Good idea to list what is going on. I think that knowing other regions and institutions are developing action plans for WZACS implementation will be very motivating."

Dave Morgan, Director of PAAZAB, the African Zoo Association, writes that PAAZAB will convene a single day workshop during its Annual Conference 8-12 May 2006 in East London, South Africa to cover the Association's implementation of WZACS.

Rosamira Guillen, Executive Director of ALPZA, the Latin American Zoos and Aquariums Association, writes that their (Association) meeting in April 2005 was completely focused on implementing the Strategy. "Based on that we had our ACOPAZOA (Colombian Zoo Assn.) meeting this past July, also about developing strategic planning around the strategy. From that meeting we decided we will develop a workshop on October, here in Barranquilla Zoo, for Colombian Zoos, on how to contextualize the strategy on our cultural and economic situation, and incorporate it on the strategic planning of each member institution, defining how our work will contribute to conservation."

Peter Dollinger, Executive Director of the World Association of Zoos and Aquaria sent a list of WZACS related activities in which he has been or will be involved in 2005.

Thanks for sending us the WAZA's new Conservation Strategy document. I have just finished browsing through and found it to be an extremely useful and handy document. I wish enough policy makers and in large number of countries around the world could peruse and use it. Two things strike me immediately. One in which SAZARC could play a part. That is to work on developing standards for Zoos in the region to enable them to apply for, get inspected and win status recognition (say on lines of ISO 14000) and then use such a recognition in various ways least of which could be their brand development. Since such a standardisation would assess a Zoo in an holistic manner it would ultimately be the wild animals there who would come to benefit. I realise that what the CZA is trying to do as part of its recognition drill is somewhat on these lines but

this would be something much more rigorous and ongoing. Second is of course to do with our (PEACE) expertise in CITES. I was happy to note the important mention of Zoos meeting the CITES requirements while accessing animals from overseas. Unfortunately CITES is little understood by most practitioners. We at PEACE through our Research and Resource Centre on CITES can offer our advisory and training services to the Zoo world.
